



1800 Couples Receive Blessing

How can you describe the Blessing in Korea of 1,800 couples from 120 different nations? "The only way I could describe it is as a series of miracles," said Mrs. Glenn Strait, formerly Louise Berry, in a report to Washington church members.

The first miracle was selecting the candidates, notifying them, keeping them informed, and getting all of them to Korea together, all within a few weeks' time. A committee of blessed couples spent many sleepless nights picking an equal number of qualified American men and women to send to Korea as candidates for the Blessing. The Headquarters staff worked double and triple time sending out notices and instructions. Helen Glass, formerly Helen Koepke, performed a small

miracle of her own in coordinating passports, visas, and travel arrangements with Korean Airlines for the more than 140 people who finally went.

The second major miracle was, in a word, the Korean Family. "When I got to Korea, the feeling there was overwhelming," said Peggy Warden Matsuya. "It was such a high spiritual feeling. I never experienced anything like it before. I felt in my heart that even if I didn't get blessed, it was worth it just to go to Korea. Throughout the whole time we were there we were given so much!"

At the airport in Seoul, the candidates were greeted by a crowd of Korean Family holding a big banner saying "Welcome Western Couples—Congratulations on Your Wedding," singing "Tongil," and waving flags. Then the candidates boarded tourist

buses which drove to the little village of Sootae-Ri (pronounced Soo-taeng-Ni) outside of Seoul, the site of our Family's training center, Tongil Industries manufacturing plant, and the Il-Hwa Ginseng Tea factory.

The training center consists of two long lecture hall-dormitory buildings, another long building for worker's rooms and Master's quarters, and a 500-seat dining hall. The center can accommodate up to 500 people at a time for Victory over Communism or Divine Principle seminars, but soon as many as 1,600 Western, Japanese, and Korean members were using the center at any one time. "Wall-to-wall people; a constant traffic jam; a mob scene," were the words used to describe it; but they were all our Family, so the spiritual atmosphere, as Peggy said, was "overwhelming."

The Korean Family did a truly miraculous job feeding, caring for, and organizing all these people. Tongil Industries manufactured many sturdy, triple-tiered bunks for the new arrivals. In addition to the dormitory rooms already there, the lecture halls were turned into huge bedrooms. Bunks lined the walls of one lecture hall used for the men's room, and every available inch of floor space in both halls was covered with folding foam-rubber mattresses. Ample pillows and blankets were supplied and steam heating was specially installed, so no one suffered at night from the below-freezing temperatures.

Meals had to be eaten in three shifts because of the limited capacity of the dining hall. The Korean Family took special care and expense to provide only Western food so that no one

suffered from stomach problems due to dietary culture shock.

Personal cleanliness was taken care of in a way which the Western couples will long remember with special fondness: the Public Bath. Quite common in Korea and Japan, public bathing was a new experience to most of the Westerners. All agreed that it would be wonderful to begin that custom in the United States. The baths consist of large men's and women's washrooms equipped with rows of hot and cold water spigots and large pool-size tubs of warm and hot water. After soaping down and rinsing off at the spigots, using a little plastic pan to splash yourself with, you jump into one of the tubs for a warm, relaxing soak.

All of the Western couples were amazed and awed at the work our Family was doing in Korea. The training center-factory complex where the couples stayed was impressive enough, but especially miraculous was the beautiful Little Angels' Performing Arts Center designed by Mr. Duk Moon Aum, a long-time Family member who is an outstanding architect in Korea.

The newly Blessed couples visited the Center on the night before their departure, hosted by Col. Pak and a host of Little Angels. The 5,000 seat auditorium and entertainment part of the Center was still under construction, but the performing arts school was fully built and already in full operation. The graceful building could be compared in significance to the Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., although everyone felt that our building was architecturally and aesthetically far superior. The land for the building, in a children's park, was donated by the government, and the Center promises to be a major cultural center for visiting foreign dignitaries when it is completed.

Seeing these things, the Western members felt that the Korean people were finally coming around to accept our Church and our Father, as the savior of Korea and the world. They could see it in the faces of the villagers who crowded around wherever they were, awestruck at this crowd of foreigners who had descended into their midst. Even the professional tour guides who led the couples on a sightseeing tour said that they had become interested in the Unification Church, promising to come to lectures. They were won over by the warm spirit of the Western couples, seeing that it was Rev. Moon who had made these people from all over the world so unified and happy.

The Westerners were also privileged to hear Master discuss his plans for the next three years. At a speech to the newly-blessed Western couples at the Sootack-Ri Training Center in Korea on Feb. 9, Master discussed the role that the Blessed couples will play in the coming three-year period. He stressed that the couples are privileged to have participated in the historical 1,800 couples Blessing, and would be the "locomotive" to fulfill the main goals during this period.

The biggest miracle, of course, was Master's selection of our mates on February 3. Before the matching be-

gan, Master spoke to the candidates on why we call our marriages a "blessing." He said that the original purpose of God's creation is the four position foundation. In the four position foundation, the vertical love coming from God to the children is subject, while the horizontal love between the mates is object. Therefore vertical love is most important in the marriage. "In the Orient," Master said, "husband and wife tend to love their parents and their children more than each other. In the West couples rather forget their parents and their children and love each other only. You must follow more the Oriental way."

He said that to be qualified for the blessing we must become true sons and daughters of God. "The qualification for the blessing is possessing God's love," he said, "and therefore being able to have God's son or daughter as your mate. In that way you can have dominion over the entire universe. Without divine love there, no such thing can be realized. That is why we call the marriage a 'blessing'."

At the end of his talk, he spoke of what a great responsibility the matching was for him. He asked the candidates whether they wanted to select their own preferences or to leave it up to him. All the candidates chorused a thunderous "yes" to leaving it in his hands.

Nobody knew exactly what to expect. Feelings ranged from excited to nervous to scared. The candidates could rely only on their faith in Master.

As Master began to match the

couples, fears were quickly dispelled. Joe Tully remarked, "Everyone could see, after the people were put together that it was just right; they were just the right people for each other."

The matching began in the largest lecture hall about 3:00 p.m. The men and women sat at the opposite ends of the room. Starting with the physically oldest members first and moving through various categories of age, position, etc., Master began to match the couples. When he would pick two people, they would go into a small adjoining room to consult with one another. If they accepted, they came out and bowed to Master, and everyone applauded. If they found some difficulty, they could try again or express a preference. Sometimes Master accepted their preference, sometimes he advised against it. Invariably, we found that Master's judgment was the best.

Many of the couples hardly knew or had never even seen each other before. However, once they began to talk with one another after the engagement, after the blessing, in Tokyo and back in the United States visiting their parents, the real miracle became more and more apparent.

Lynda Champion McKenzie, who had never met her husband Hal before then, recalled, "From that point on we began finding out how much Master really knew what he was doing... Our parents were shocked at how much we had in common. Hal's father remarked, 'Hal could have searched for a million years and never have found someone

with so many complementary points as Lynda. Rev. Moon can match better than any computer!'"

Other couples had similar experiences. Couples were constantly discovering new coincidences, common features, crossing junctures, and complementary associations in their mates' personalities, dreams, backgrounds, and ancestors.

The most prevalent feeling was that God had been arranging the whole thing all along; that their mates had been created just for them. Master, knowing God's heart and will for each of them, had brought them together. Ernie Stewart said to the New York Family: "God made someone perfectly for me, and I know that He's doing the same for you."

After the engagements, the unfolding miracle of this discovery seemed to make all the succeeding events blend into one continuous miracle. The mass wedding ceremony at Changchung gymnasium, witnessing on the streets in Tokyo; Master's speech at the Budokan Hall in Tokyo, the choosing of the international missionaries, the couples returning home and visiting their parents and relatives; and so on, all hold precious memories for each participant. But especially, each participant will hold forever in their hearts their own unique and precious story of how their mates for eternity were chosen.



1,500 Japanese Now in Seoul For Mass Wedding Tomorrow

TOKYO (AP) — Dozens of young Japanese left Tokyo recently on their way to Seoul to be married in one of the world's largest mass weddings.

About 1,500 Japanese are among the 3,200 members of a Korea-based religious group founded by the 54-year-old Rev. Moon Sun-myung scheduled to be married in a giant ceremony Feb. 8.

Miss Nobuko Hokari, 29, of Tokyo, is one of the 1,600 prospective brides whose husbands have been chosen for them by the Rev. Moon.

"We sent him our photographs and then he told us who we should marry when he came to Japan for a short trip in January," she said in an interview.

"He knew instantly our spiritual insides and could choose the right partners for us."

The religion's formal title is "Holy Spirit Association for the Unification of World Christianity." It is called more simply "Unification Church" and is a Christian sect claiming a worldwide following of over two million, based on the teachings of Rev. Moon.

It strives to unite all Christians under the teachings of its founder and refutes ideologies such as socialism, communism and atheism, a church

spokesman said.

One of the sect's major tenets is the importance of marriage and it calls adultery the world's worst crime.

This will be the second mass wedding sponsored by the church. The first visit to Korea without knowing whom they would marry, and within a two-week period were matched up by the Rev. Moon and

married in a ceremony at which he officiated.

Yasuhiko Toyomura, 27, of Tokyo, who was among them said he is happy with the marriage, although he and his wife Yoshiko have lived together for only about a year.

They work on opposite sides of the globe for the religion — she in Washington, D.C. and he in Tokyo.

"Rev. Moon knows my wife more than I do," said Toyomura. "He understands the internal and spiritual worlds of a person and when he said she was the right partner for me, we both knew instantly he was right."

Final Decision

"But the final decision is ours. If we don't want to accept his advice, it's Okay."

Some of the parents of the young couples have protested the upcoming wedding, saying their children do not know their future spouses and are being alienated from home and family by the religion. About 20 have withdrawn from the ceremony.

Scuffles have been reported at Tokyo's airport between members of the wedding party and their families who were unable to persuade them not to be married.

Members who wish to be married by the Rev. Moon first must give long service to the church and introduce about three new converts. Many of the prospective brides and bridegroom are full-time employees of the religion.

"The reason I want to be married," said Miss Hokari, "is because two people are stronger than one and we can work harder for the religion. My future husband and I do

not plan a married life for about three years. Instead, we will go abroad for training."

A spokesman for the religion said there have never been any divorces in the church.

"According to the principles of the religion, divorce is not possible" the spokesman said. "unless they fall away from the church and then divorce is a personal decision."

Meanwhile, Unification Church sponsored "day of hope festivals" in Japan have filled auditoriums to capacity offering a program of songs, movies and lectures. On the streets of Tokyo and in other parts of Japan, young people, both Japanese and foreign, have been passing out literature and selling flowers in a campaign to increase the 200,000 Japanese membership and raise funds.

"I don't have time to become a member," said one middle aged businessman at one lecture, "but I suppose many young Japanese will join because they (the religion) have pretty girls and nice boys from many countries and good lectures."

"I myself go to the meetings for two reasons. One is to find the true reason for living. The other is to brush up on my English."

Mass Wedding Rites

Moon Perfumes 1,801 Pairs

Many brides and grooms were sobbing in apparent religious ecstasy while Moon Sun-myung, leader of the controversial Unification Church, prayed for their eternal relationship with God at the church's big international mass wedding at Changchung Gymnasium in Seoul yesterday.

Exactly 1,801 couples from Korea, Japan, the United States and 17 other countries in various parts of the world were married in the ceremony, possibly the biggest wedding ever held in human history.

Clad in silver gowns and wearing impressive silver crowns, Moon and his wife, Mrs. Han Hak-cha, officiated in the ceremony by offering prayers and spreading perfume over the entering brides and grooms.

All the brides wore the traditional Korean Chima and Chogori and white veils despite their different nationalities, while the grooms were in dark suits.

They pledged eternal partnership and loyalty to the church by answering "I do" in

roaring unison to Moon standing on a lofty stage presiding over the ceremony.

Some 10,000 well-wishers and believers attended the ceremony jampacking Seoul's

biggest gymnasium. The ceremony lasted for nearly two and a half hours.

It was the eighth joint wedding ceremony organized by the Holy Spirit Association

for the Unification of World Christianity since 1960. In October, 1970, 777 couples were matched in a similar international event.

Founded in 1954 by Moon, the church has been one of the most controversial new religions in the country because of its rapidly expanding economic and political power and Moon's overseas missionary activities in recent years.

Firmly standing against communism, the church has 34 national missionary headquarters outside Korea in addition to 380,000 domestic believers, according to its own estimate.

The mass wedding is explained as one of the church's policies to prove its doctrine that "the world is one family."

In order to get married, members "who are basically qualified for marriage" participate in a special training program by submitting recommendation from the chiefs of their church districts, copies of their birth certificates, statements of their educational records and health certificates.

During a two-week training session, they are introduced to other applicants. After the first three days they give the church authorities a list of five most desirable persons for Moon to give the final decision.

If one does not want to get matched with a person designated by Moon, he can meet with other people until he comes across the right one, the church administrators explain.

All the 1,801 couples had a parade through some of Seoul's main streets aboard 94 sightseeing buses right after ceremony.


In the evening they were entertained by a variety show featuring famous pop singers, comedians and the Little Angels, and the children's singing and dancing troupe run by the church.

The wedded couples come from Korea, Japan, the United States, Britain, Germany, France, Italy, Austria, Holland, Taiwan, Canada, Brazil, Argentina, Switzerland, Ireland, Sweden, Norway, Belgium, Australia and Trinidad.

Wedding Involves Alaskan

An Alaskan will be a participant tomorrow in the largest wedding ceremony in history when the Rev. Sun Myung Moon unites 1,800 couples in a massive ceremony in Seoul, Korea.

Local representatives of the Unification Church, which was founded by the Rev. Moon, have learned that Ray Bacon of Palmer, who has been active in the movement for three years in San Francisco, is among those to be married.

Tomorrow's wedding will be more than double the size of one performed by the Rev. Moon in 1970. At that time, 777 couples were married.

None of Stein's relatives or Huntington friends were expected to be at the ceremony, although 10,000 wedding guests are expected at the Korean ceremonies, church officials said.

Heater said that the 1,800 couples have postponed their marriages for the past five years to be able to participate in the mass ceremony tomorrow, considering it an historical occasion.

He said that although the Unification Church, founded in 1954 by the Rev. Moon, considers itself a Christian faith, the main difference in its teachings is that while other Christian sects teach that Jesus Christ fully saved the human race, Rev. Moon teaches that Christ was not able to fulfill a total salvation because of people's disbelief in his immortality.



Moon is generally opposed by the Christian community as well as other sources.

A news report from Japan indicates that a group of Japanese parents, whose children were married in the mass wedding, have vowed to fight Mr. Moon and his association until their children return to "normal life."

The parents' group, which claims to have 500 members, said in a joint statement that the young couples had been "matched" by Mr. Moon.

The Unification Church, founded in 1954, now claims to have more than two million members in 50 countries. A mass wedding of 777 couples was conducted in Seoul by Mr. Moon in 1970.

1600 Couples? Holy Matrimony!

TOKYO (AP)—Dozens of young Japanese are leaving Tokyo these days on their way to Seoul, Korea, to be married in one of the world's largest mass weddings.

About 1,500 Japanese are among the 3,200 members of a Korea-based religious group, founded by the 54-year-old Rev. Sun Myung Moon, Saturday married in a giant ceremony.

Nobuko Hokari, 29, of Tokyo, is one of the 1,600 brides whose husbands were chosen for them by the Rev. Mr. Moon.

"We sent him our photographs and then he told us who we should marry when he came to Japan for a short trip in January," she says.

"He knew instantly our spiritual insides and could choose the right partners for us."

The religion's formal title is "Holy Spirit Association for the Unification of World Christianity." It is called more simply "Unification Church," and is a Christian sect claiming a worldwide following of over two million, based on the teachings of the Rev. Mr. Moon.

It strives to unite all Christians under the teachings of its founder and refutes ideologies such as socialism, communism and atheism, a church spokesman said.

One of the sect's major tenets is the importance of marriage and it calls adultery the world's worst crime.

This was to be the second mass wedding sponsored by the church. The first was in 1970 when 1,554 members went to Korea without knowing whom they would marry, and within a two-week period were matched up by the Rev. Mr. Moon and married in a ceremony at which he officiated.

Yasohiro Toyomura, 27, of Tokyo, who was among them, says he is happy with the marriage, although he and his wife, Yoshiko, have lived together for only about a year. They work on opposite sides of the globe for the religion—she is in Washington, D.C., and he in Tokyo.


"Rev. Moon knows my wife more than I do," says Toyomura. "He understands the internal and spiritual worlds of a person and when he said she was the right partner for me, we both knew instantly he was right."

"But the final decision is ours. If we don't want to accept his advice, it's okay."

Members who wish to be married by the Rev. Mr. Moon first must give long service to the church and introduce about three new converts. Many of the prospective brides and bridegrooms are full-time employees of the religion.

The reason I wanted to be married," says Miss Hokari, "is because two people are stronger than one and we can work harder for the religion."

"My future husband and I do not plan to lead a married life for about three years."



Instead, we will go abroad for training." As spokesman for the religion says there have never been any divorces in the church.

"According to the principles of the religion, divorce is not possible," the spokesman says "unless they fall away from the church and then divorce is a personal decision."

Meanwhile, Unification Church sponsored "Day of Hope Festivals" in Japan have filled auditoriums to capacity offering a program of songs, movies and lectures. On the streets of Tokyo and in other parts of Japan, young people, both Japanese and foreign, have been passing out literature and selling flowers in a campaign to increase the 200,000 Japanese membership and raise funds.

"I don't have time to become a member," says one middle-aged businessman at a lecture. "But I suppose many young Japanese will join because they (the religion) have pretty girls and nice boys from many countries and good lectures."

"I myself go to the meetings for two reasons. One is to find the true reason for living. The other is to brush up on my English."

An estimated 10,000 people rose and shouted three Korean "marry" cheers as confetti fell from 14 baskets hung under the dome-shaped ceiling. Moon and his wife, Mrs. Han Blakes, sprinkled perfume over them.

The couples included 145 from the United States, 297 from Japan, 12 from Britain, 19 from West Germany, 15 from Austria, nine from France, six from Holland, four from Canada, 15 from Taiwan, 1,264 from South Korea, two from Belgium, Italy, and Australia and one each from Mexico, Switzerland, Israel, Trinidad, Estonia, Brazil, Argentina and Sweden.

Brides and bridegrooms were kept for more than an hour in 18-degree temperatures outside the gymnasium waiting for the ceremony to start. It took almost another hour for them to line up inside on the red-carpeted floor.

Michael Wieder, 28, of Tarrytown, N.Y., said after the ceremony, "I am a very happy man."

Wieder referred to the high divorce rate in the United States and added, "In the Unification Church, I think 1 or 2 percent have been divorced."

"In this sense, the Rev. Moon has a very wise and tested method. In (his) marriage he has a very good result," said Wieder, a 1968 graduate of Stanford University.

Wieder met his bride Cheryl, 26, of Seattle, Wash., in Paris in 1968, when he gave a lecture on the Moon movement which now claims 500,000 followers throughout the world.



The ceremony was held in the Changchung gymnasium before an audience of about 10,000, who rose after the minister pronounced the 3,600 newlyweds men and wives and shouted in Korean "manser" (cheers) three times.

Clouds of confetti dropped from baskets hanging from the ceiling.

The brides and grooms waited in 18-degree cold for an hour before they could get into the gym, and once inside it took nearly an hour to line up on the red-carpeted floor.

They passed by a platform on their way in and the Rev. Moon and his wife, Han Hak-ja, sprinkled perfume over them.

The grooms were dressed in black and dark green suits and the brides in white chimajugori, traditional Korean dresses, with white veils.

Randy Berndt, 27, of Walnut Creek, Calif., said after the ceremony, "I am very happy," and his bride, Beverly Howe, 24, of Lexington, Mass., said, "I feel wonderful."

"I believe in God and world unification," Berndt said. "This religious movement was started in Korea and it is natural and significant that we come here to demonstrate the goal of our church."

'I Do... 3600 Times'

In Seoul, Korea, this morning, the Rev. Sun Myung Moon, center, back to camera, officiated at a mass wedding for 1,800 couples. The newlyweds came from all over the world, including 145 pairs from the U.S. and 297 from Japan. Moon wore a gilded crown and a white embroidered robe. New York, N.Y.—AP—The Korean religious group founder, the Rev. Sun Myung Moon, plans another mass marriage of his followers, this time 1,600 couples, a spokesman for the group has disclosed.

He said 3,200 young people, including 70 couples from the United States, will be married simultaneously Feb. 8 in the Changchung gymnasium in Seoul, Korea, the largest mass wedding ever held.

In the teachings of the group, called the Unification Church, followers who have reached an advanced stage of dedication are allowed to submit names of preferred mates, with final approval by Moon.

They may designate several possible choices in order of preference. In cases on which Moon does the matching, "they don't have to accept," the spokesman said. "It's up to them."

However, in the group, Moon is deemed to be a special bearer of God's revelation, with teachings of his group implying that he may be a "Second Messiah" to complete the work of Jesus.

Jesus' mission is regarded by the group as having failed in part because he was crucified.

The second planned mass marriage is the second that he has performed. Another, involving 777 couples was performed in Korea in 1970.

Couples involved this time are from 24 nations, with 10,000 guests expected to be on hand.

In the group's teachings, the "marriages are eternal because of the intense devotion to God" of those involved, the spokesman said.



The couples included 145 from the United States, 297 from Japan, 12 from Britain, 19 from West Germany, 15 from Austria, nine from France, six from Holland, four from Canada, 15 from Taiwan, 1,264 from South Korea, two from Belgium, Italy and Australia and one each from Mexico, Switzerland, Israel, Trinidad, Estonia, Brazil, Argentina and Sweden.

Brides and grooms were kept for more than an hour in 18-degree temperatures outside the gymnasium waiting for the ceremony to start. It took almost another hour for them to line up inside on the red-carpeted floor.

Michael Warder, 28, of Tarrytown, N.Y., said after the ceremony, "I am a very happy man."

Warder referred to the high divorce rate in the United States and added: "In the Unification Church, I think 1 or 2 percent have been divorced."

Unification Church Holds Mass Wedding

The largest wedding ceremony in history will be held today in Seoul, Korea. The Rev. Sun Myung Moon will officiate at the wedding of 1,800 couples who have come from 21 nations to participate in the ceremony. Over 70 couples from the U.S. will be included.

The wedding will begin at 10 a.m. at Changchung gymnasium, the largest hall in Korea. The men will all wear blue suits, while the women will wear the traditional white Korean dress with wedding veils. The couples will take their vows simultaneously, with 10,000 wedding guests attending.

Following the ceremony, the couples will board nearly 100 buses for an extensive parade-tour of Seoul. That night, they will return for a huge reception featuring entertainment by top professional performers and the couples themselves.

After the Korean festivities, the American couples will travel to Japan to attend the Rev. Moon's speaking engagement at Budokan Hall in Tokyo, the Madison Square Garden of Japan.

The American couples are due to return home about Feb. 16.
